Greetings in the Lord! It is now the time of year when we can say "Winter is now past, the rain is over and gone. The flowers have appeared in our land, the time of pruning is come." (Canticle of Canticles 2:11-12) We have indeed begun pruning our orchard, and witnessing the brave crocuses and snowdrops poke through the bare earth as the first heralds of spring. The season of Lent is a time for a new springtime within our souls, in which the Lord invites us to deep interior renewal and growth. May the season be a time of pruning for all of us, so that we may bring forth beautiful spiritual fruit in our lives!

Much exterior growth has taken place in the community as well. We now have eight postulants at the Abbey and four at Monastery of St. Joseph in Ava, where construction has continued on through the winter months. We are so grateful to God for the 'fiat' of these young women, and have already received nine requests for entrance in this coming year. So, the obligation to continue building is incumbent upon us, as we would have no room to house any more Sisters. As it stands, we will have to leave the church unfinished, as moving the community into a larger living space will take priority.

Sadly, some major benefactions in which we had placed great hope never materialized, so it was necessary to secure a loan from the bank, unfortunately at a very high interest rate of 8.6% with about \$7 out of \$18 million left to go. We are inquiring with other religious houses and groups about loans of any amount with lower interest rates, as we want to be the best stewards of the gifts given to us as possible. Perhaps someone reading this, while not in a position to give a major gift, would consider a low or no interest loan to assist in this manner? We would be delighted to hear from you if so!



These vocations that "ran in the family" now run together to the Lord!




